



WARM SEASON VEGETABLES

and Their Planting Times



Warm season vegetables love heat! Plant them after the danger of frost has passed and the soil is warm for the best growth and biggest harvest.

VEGETABLE	SOIL TEMPERATURE NEEDED	WHEN TO PLANT	NOTES
 Tomatoes	 Above 60°F (15.5°C)	 2–3 weeks after last frost	Transplant seedlings. Keep soil warm and moist.
 Peppers	 Above 60°F (15.5°C)	 2–3 weeks after last frost	Transplant seedlings. Protect from cold nights.
 Beans	 Above 60°F (15.5°C)	 1–2 weeks after last frost	Sow seeds directly in the garden.
 Cucumbers	 Above 65°F (18°C)	 2 weeks after last frost	Sow seeds directly. Needs warm soil to grow well.
 Squash	 Above 65°F (18°C)	 2 weeks after last frost	Sow seeds directly. Needs lots of space.
 Corn	 Above 55°F (13°C)	 1–2 weeks after last frost	Sow seeds directly in blocks for best results.



Tip: Warm soil = happy roots! Use a soil thermometer for the most accurate planting results.
